Here are some items we are looking forward to sharing with you:

Synchronous Instruction/Supports: Our CTs (credentialed teachers) will continue to offer opportunities for daily live instruction to TK-3 grade students, daily live interaction to 4-8 grade students, and weekly live instruction to 4-12 grade students. These opportunities include:

WHAT IS GS7 FROM THE ALDER GROVE CLASSES SCHEDULE?

DEVELOPING NUMERICAL FLUENCY

Every month we will feature a new math tip or resource from the book *Developing Numerical Fluency* by Patsy Kanter and Steven Leinwand.

We hope you and your students love these tips as the Alder Grove CTs do!

What is Numerical Fluency:

- Numerical fluency is about understanding, not memorization.
- Numerical fluency is supported by fingers, pictures, and all sorts of materials- that is, multiple
 representations that best fit individual students' conceptions.
- Numerical fluency develops when students communicate their understanding and construct and share their strategies.
- Numerical fluency is developed much more through engaging tasks and activities with rich questions and student discourse than through endless practice with mindless "get-the-answer" worksheets.

What Numerical Fluency is not:


- Fluency is not instantaneous recall.
- Fluency doesn't mean that students don't use their fingers.
- Fluency doesn't always indicate a student's mathematical ability.

MANDATORY SPEECH AND LANGUAGE SCREENING

Dear Teachers and Parents/Guardians,

Beginning this October, we will be offering an intensive Pre-Literacy Skills program to primary grade students. This program will target phonemic awareness and narrative language skills in a small group setting. The purpose of these groups is to strengthen the foundation of oral language skills needed for students to become future readers. Research has shown that early identification and intervention of these skills has the greatest impact on future literacy development.

In order to identify the students who would benefit most from the Pre-Literacy Skills program, or may benefit from additional speech and language support, we will be conducting a mandatory speech and language screening to all TK-1st grade students.

CT's and families with TK, K, and first grade students will work together to find a time for the student to come on campus for the screening. Please see the sign-up sheet emailed to CT's and schedule any available 30 minute slot with your student's name. After the screening, the speech-language pathologist will contact you with the results and recommendations.

PBIS UPDATE: AUGUST 2022

Welcome back to school, Alder Grove community! We are looking forward to a great 2022-23 school year, with some exciting new changes to our Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS):

1. **Brand new Bark Bucks** — Our Bark Bucks have been simplified to make them more user friendly and easier to give out to students.

2. School Store — New this school year! Instead of holding a weekly raffle, students will be able to collect their Bark Bucks to use at our school store.

Prizes range from small to large so students have the option of saving up for a treasured item, or spending their bucks on smaller items more frequently.

The school store will be open during breakfast and lunch, and at 2:30pm each day. It is located in the last cubby, right next to the study hall area.

Coming soon: We are in the process of creating PBIS posters for each section of the school, so be on the lookout for these cool new additions!



MENTAL HEALTH SCREENINGS—IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Across the country there is growing recognition of the importance of meeting the mental and behavioral health needs of children, and the critical role of schools in doing this work.

- One in five students suffers from a mental health disorder and roughly 80% of children who are in need of mental health services do not receive them
- Recent data collected during the COVID19 pandemic indicates that roughly one in four students over the age of 11 have experienced suicide ideation
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death of children between 12 and 17 years of age
- 70-80% of students who do receive mental health services receive them in school
- Students are more likely to seek help if they need it if services are available in schools

It is common practice for schools statewide and nationwide to use a mental health screening tool to gather social, emotional data to inform mental health supports. Alder Grove Charter also uses a mental health screening tool with 4th-12th grade students to gather this data.

Universal screening data will be used for:

- Examining the pulse of our school and understanding the unique needs of our students as a whole and individually.
- Informing and implementing a range of mental and behavioral health supports and interventions.
- Early intervention for students identified as being at risk for mental health issues (which is known to be critical in prevention of worsening issues).
- Ongoing safety and crisis prevention.
- Engaging in a broad range of community partnerships to further support students and families.
- Informing professional development for school staff, families, and communities.


Universal screening data will NOT be used for:

- Labeling students with mental health disorders. (Mental health disorders can only be diagnosed by medical doctors.)
- Mandating support services for individuals or groups. All supports are optional and will follow the "family choice" motto of Alder Grove.
- Pushing interventions that families would not like for their student(s).
- Sharing information about individual students with anyone outside of a relevant school team, including parent/guardians.


The universal screening tool being utilized is called the Behavioral and Emotional Screening System (BESS) and consists of a short student survey that is estimated to take 3-5 minutes to complete. The BESS student survey examines internalizing risk, selfregulation, and personal adjustment. All data gathered is confidential, and individual data will not be shared with those outside of relevant school staff and parent/guardians.

CTs will complete online surveys with students during the month of September. A very high participation rate is critical to informing our efforts. Even if you do not have concerns, it is the expectation that all students in the 4th-12th grades will participate.
