- a. Directors Report: Enrollment is steady at 450. There are 130 interested in orientations, which may be held in April. The SARC report minus the physical fitness test data is ready for review and will be posted on website after PFT information is in. There was some discussion concerning the accuracy of the PFT reporting. The first interimpalooza for middle school and high school is scheduled for this Friday with 15 students signed up. Brooke is working on the development of an E-sports club. Gaming is becoming a big thing for colleges. A Special Circumstances Instructional Aide has been hired for a visually impaired student. The new aide is Stephanie Brown, a former AGCS parent. The Statewide Science Assessment (CAST) results from last Spring are in. Scored reporting will be provided to CT's and mailed out to families.
- b. Student Council Report: Gracie, the Student Council Treasurer updated the Council on the numerous events being planned for. A Spirit Week in February with a number of "themed" days. A bake sale for March 7th is planned to take place at Pierson's Building Center. A student talent showcase/fundraiser is in the works for April. Money raised last year went to Betty Chinn's non-profit organization. They are also planning for a middle school party and prom.
- c. Leadership Team Report: Stefani stated that there is a hope that more parents will become involved. Two LCAP goals should be addressed per meeting. She had previously submitted the Employee Lactation Accommodation Policy. The policy had been developed in consultation with the assistance of a local lactation organization. The Leadership Team has reviewed our WASC Mid-Cycle Progress Report. Stefani also provided the Council with a preliminary report on the Healthy Kids grant which funded the new water cooler and other items for our lunchroom. Another item discussed for purchase was a bike rack to encourage healthy ways of getting to school.

d. Director of Special Education Report: Nichole provided a written report and recommendations to the Council on distribution of special education duties for next year between Crystal, Sarah, and Tim. She also recommended hiring a school psychologist intern.
