GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Alder Grove Charter School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Alder Grove Charter School will jointly develop with parents and distribute to parents of participating children, a Parental Involvement Policy that the school and parents of participating children agree on.
- Alder Grove Charter School will notify parents about the Parental Involvement Policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, will distribute this policy to parents in a language the parents can understand.
- Alder Grove Charter School will make the Parental Involvement Policy available to the local community.
- o Alder Grove Charter School will periodically update the Parental Involvement Policy to meet the changing needs of parents and the school.

- that other activities, such as those described in section (D) 1118 of the ESEA, are carried out.

Alder Grove Charter School will implement required school parental involvement policy components as follows:

 - (a) If requested by parents, Alder Grove Charter School will provide parents of participating children opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible:
 - through prearranged meetings with the Title I Coordinator
 - through meetings with the student's teacher which may include the Title I Coordinator, the director, and other staff as appropriate
 - (b) Teachers and staff will submit to the director any parent comments if the school wide plan under section (1114)(b)(2) is not satisfactory to parents of participating children:
 - o Parents may submit comments in writing regarding the school wide plan to their child's teacher, the Title I Coordinator, or the director.

RESPONSIBILITIES FOR HIGH STUDENT ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Alder Grove Charter School will build the schools' and parents' 1. capacity for strong parental involvement in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership between the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following activities:
 - Regularly scheduled meetings with teachers
 - Parental access to the Teacher/Parent Resource library and other resources such as web sites, newsletters, etc.
 - Parent Trainings
- The school will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school in understanding topics such as the following:
 - > the State's academic content standards,
 - > the State and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - > the requirements of Title I,
 - how to monitor their child's progress

Parents will receive training and necessary information on the topics above through:

- > Resource Guides including easy to understand standards with examples
- > List of web sites
- School sponsored trainings and workshops.
- As appropriate, the school will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement and to foster parental involvement, by:
 - > Holding regular Title I meetings,
 - > Holding annual Math Fairs and curriculum shares,
 - > Encouraging parental participation in the School Leadership Team and Governance Council
 - > Offerins school sponsored parent trainings on topics suggested by parents and staff when appropriate and possible

- The school will educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, 4. director and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
 - Regular teacher meetings with parents
 - Staff trainings
- The school will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, take the 5. following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
 - > Upon identification of parental need for information in another language or in another format, the school will take steps to ensure that the parent request is fulfilled.
